CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Board of Education of Sesser-Valier Community Unit School District No. 196 was held in the High School Library at 6:00 PM on Monday, July 10, 2017. The meeting was called to order by President Carroll Kelly.

PUBLIC COMMENT & CORRESPONDENCE

Superintendent Henry presented a thank you card from the family of Julia Williams for the expression of sympathy from the board.

REPORTS

CUSTODIAL & MAINTENANCE SUPERVISOR: Brandon Dilliner, Maintenance Supervisor, presented information regarding the summer projects including the replacement of the clocks, the new fire alarm system, new sign project, and the sealing of the parking lot.

K-8 PRINCIPAL: Mrs. Logsdon, Elementary/JH Principal, presented information regarding the following to the board: Trust fund, upcoming activities and dates, and professional development activities.

H.S. PRINCIPAL: Mrs. Page, High School Principal, presented information regarding the following to the board: Trust fund, upcoming calendar entries, and summer activities.

SUPERINTENDENT: Mr. Henry, Superintendent, presented the following information to the board:

- 1. The consent agenda for this month's meeting includes the following additional item(s):
 - Approval of an expense reimbursement regulation resolution (required by a recent change in state law);
 - Approval of a Section 403(b) Plan Administrative Services Agreement (American Fidelity);
 - Approval of revised board policies (1st reading).
- 2. The Illinois General Assembly has overridden Governor Rauner's vetoes of three (3) state revenue & budget bills, making this the first full state budget in over 2 years. For school funding, though, Senate Bill 1, the massive overhaul of the school funding formula, remains in limbo after the General Assembly passed the bill and, through a parliamentary procedure, has held the bill (no time-clock running) from Governor Rauner's promised veto.

As a result of these recent legislative actions, school funding is still uncertain for FY18. There are 2-3 possible options with Senate Bill 1, and it's anybody's guess about how that will move forward (if at all). The full state budget, however, requires that the school funding allocation be spent through the evidence-based funding model. So, if Governor Rauner vetoes SB1, then there is no school funding expense authority unless 1) the General Assembly overrides the veto, or 2) another evidence-based funding model legislative package is approved.

Superintendent Henry cautiously reported that, based on unaudited figures, if the evidence-based funding model legislation is enacted and if the Illinois General Assembly funds the evidence-based funding model general state aid as preliminary reports have indicated, with the recent district expense reductions, the district should get very close to a break-even budget in Fiscal Year 2018. He indicated that, assuming 1) GSA is funded and 2) mandated categorical payments are made at a rate of four per year, staff reductions via attrition (4 positions from 2016-2017 into 2017-2018) should help the district to make significant gains in reducing deficit spending. He indicated that the recent opening of a JHS Science Teacher position would likely be filled via internal transfer (2-3 transfers needed; notices to teachers impacted as soon as possible).

Superintendent Henry encouraged the board to develop an incremental savings plan once the budget deficit is remedied to prepare for "the next rainy day that will undoubtedly come."
